While walking my dogs, I was thinking about what I wanted to write about. In a window of a house we passed was a sign that read, "Better Days Are Ahead." I immediately thought, a quilter must live here. The sign was not lovingly made of fabric and



there were no half square triangles involved. The tipoff was the upbeat message. Quilters are the ones who can look at chaos and find inspiration and art. Who else can take a box of rags and make a family heirloom? It is a gift of optimism.

Our speaker this month, Dr. Geraldine Craig, is speaking on the textile art of Hmong people. Bright, lively, and beautifully crafted quilts are the hallmark style of the Hmong people. Many refugees provided for their families by selling their traditional flower cloth and appliqué quilts. I cannot imagine a more demoralizing, transient time and yet Hmong people were able to create quilts in the hope of a new life and better things ahead.

Last month, we had a Zoom show-and-tell meeting full of talent and creativity highlighting our pandemic projects. Social isolation has been hard, and yet the Starlight Quilters are making works of art and comfort for others. Let's continue to lift each other up and inspire one another in our common gift of optimism. My prayer is that we continue to thread the needles, piece the quilts, and quilt, knowing that better days are ahead.



It will be at Excelsior Springs at <u>Lake Doniphan Retreat Center</u>, in their main building. The workroom opens out to a beautiful view of the Lake, with sleeping rooms (2 Queen beds and bath) on the same level. 

Project Linus:


