
New Website Feature: Events Calendar

2025 Community Service Project



This month's featured die is the Snail's Trail. This die creates 8" blocks and is layer cake friendly. It fits the Go cutter owned by the guild but not the smaller Go Me. Add borders for a pillow or placemat or join together for a throw or bed quilt. Use 2 colors or several. You could even make it scrappy or combine its swirl pattern with other 8" blocks. Quick Reminder of Quilt Specifications for Entry:

- 1. Entrant must have significantly participated in the making of the guilt top and/or the guilting.
- 2. All quilts must be quilted by hand or machine. Traditional Crazy Quilts may be tied: otherwise, tied or tacked quilts are not eligible.
- 3. Crafted items such as garments, bags, etc. are not eligible.
- 4. Quilts must have been completed in the years 2023-2025.
- 5. Quilts previously displayed at KCRQF are not eligible except by special invitation.
- 6. All quilts shall be between 24" 96" on any side.
- 7. All quilts must have a sewn-on label securely attached to the back of the quilt. Pinned labels are not accepted. Back, lower-left corner placement is preferred.
- 8. All quilts must have a 4 inch open ended sleeve for hanging. Sleeve must be securely sewn to the guilt.
- 9. Quilts must be in excellent condition. Incomplete, torn, soiled quilts, quilts with strong odors, or quilts with animal hair will not qualify for entry or display.
- 10. Entry must be a single, stand-alone project. No guarantee can be made that any quilt can be hung along with any other quilt. It may not be framed, mounted or covered.
- 11. Quilts embellished with sharp objects that may be hazardous to volunteers or visitors will not be accepted.
- 12. Quilts must be able to be folded, rolled or stacked. Special handling due to ruching, beading or other embellishments is not available.

Guidelines to remember:

Do not use batting if you are using a fleece backing.

Remove all pins and loose threads which could be hazardous to children.

Minimum size is 40" x 40". Preferred sizes are between 40" x 50" and 40" x 60".

Quilts should be tied (6" to 8" spacing) or machine quilted. If tying a quilt use crochet or embroidery thread. Do not use yarn.

If finishing with pillowcased edges, topstitch around the edge of the quilt.


Raffle Quilt Update

Remembering Jeanne Poore

On January 17, 2025, Starlight Quilters Guild lost one of its founding members, Jeanne Poore. Here's a little bit about Jeanne, from her obituary on the Amos Family website:

"Jeanne Poore, a cherished mother, grandmother, and friend, passed away peacefully on January 17, 2025, in Overland Park, Kansas, at the age of 82. Born on June 25, 1942, in Washington County, Kansas. Jeanne was a beacon of love, resilience, and creativity throughout her life.

An accomplished quilter, Jeanne's hands crafted countless pieces that not only warmed bodies but also hearts, each stitch telling a story of dedication and warmth. Her quilts were more than fabric and thread; they were expressions of her

boundless creativity and love, leaving a legacy that will continue to inspire those who knew her."

Mary Honas, member and SQG Programs Chair, had this recollection of Jeanne: "My mom taught me to hand piece and quilt, a strong basis to begin. Jeanne Poore taught me how to machine piece tops so I could finish. She taught a class for Starlight, at the old Mission Mall, on log cabin blocks using two grocery bags of strips, one bag with light strips and the other with dark. It was a lot of fun and I did finish that top after class. I'm pretty sure that was the first quilt I had machine quilted.

Jeanne was my inspiration as a quilting instructor. She was thorough and patient. I loved how she was able to guide her students gently and build their confidence. Her example has inspired me as a teacher for over 20 years."

The Guest book for Jeanne had these remembrances of Jeanne as a quilter and teacher:

"I love all of Jeanne's star quilt block patterns that she did for Block Party at Prairie Point. It was always nice to chat with her at the quilt store and guild meetings. She was always friendly and kind. I am glad to have those memories. She will be missed."

"Jeanne was one of my first quilting teachers. She was so patient and kind. She was very creative in her designs. She was always fun to talk with."

"Jeanne was such an inspiration. I loved taking her classes. Even though II learned to embroider when I was a child and am now in my 70's, I still learned something new with each class. Thank you, Jeanne."

SQG Member, Shirley Lewis, sent in this memory with some photos:

"This is a lovely little quilt I got at Jeanne's estate sale. I took several classes from her, and she was a class act! She told me that even if the finished block isn't the size it should be, as long as all of them were the same, all is good. I've used that advice my entire quilting life."
