From the President

I want to start by thanking Janette for leading our meeting in January; my apologies that I wasn't available on my first meeting as your President this year. I spent that week exploring and hiking in Death Valley National Park. What a beautiful spot on earth; the landscape and wildlife is much more

diverse and adaptive than one would expect for a "hot desert with a dried-up saltwater lake". One spot we visited was Artists Palette. It's tucked behind an unassuming yellow landscape that has an array of colors (red, orange, yellow, blue, pink, and green), splashed across the hills. These colors are from volcanic deposits rich in compounds such as iron oxides and chlorite, which creates a rainbow effect; additional dimensions were created by the erosive power of water. While taking in this landscape I couldn't help but think about the initial sources of fabric dyes and textiles and how women expressed themselves centuries ago with the natural products they had on hand. So resourceful! While we may not be gathering berries or dirt to dye our handwoven fabric; I can't help to think that our hunt for that perfect print or creating that amazing block holds a similar sense of delight and satisfaction that our ancestors felt.
